

INSPIRATION CLUB COMMITTEE MINUTES

June 9, 2025 | 5:30 p.m. via Zoom

The meeting was called to order at 5:34 p.m. The agenda was approved unanimously. The minutes of the May 26, 2025 meeting were approved unanimously.

Committee Update

It was noted that this was the first meeting since the Inspiration Club Subcommittee was elevated to a full Committee, following the dissolution of the Community Services Center Committee upon completion of the building construction. Director Kelleher will serve as the Board Liaison. Officer roles (Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary) are expected to be assigned at the next meeting.

Audio/Visual System

Mr. Smith reported that programming of the A/V system is scheduled for the following day. Training for staff and volunteers will follow, along with posted physical instructions and QR codes.

Internet and Technology

Ms. Innes described the internet setup, including three dedicated networks: one for the pool, one for staff and systems (including door readers and surveillance), and one public network supporting Wi-Fi and A/V streaming.

Window Graphics

Director Kelleher suggested adding custom window decals to the office and boardroom glass, possibly featuring the Inspiration name or “i” logo. A local, low-cost provider may be used. Photos of the building will be added to the district website once sent to staff.

Grand Opening Recap

The Committee reviewed the successful Grand Opening event. The steady stream of visitors and strong volunteer support were noted.

Pool Umbrellas

Director Kelleher mentioned that several pool shade umbrellas have become non-functional due to wind and exposure. The management team will replace them.

Reservation Policies

The Committee discussed the draft reservation policies and rules, which will be reviewed by Public Alliance for feedback. Implementation can be managed administratively without formal Board approval of procedural details. The team will provide a recommendation regarding credit card holds versus charging homeowner accounts for damages or cleaning. Office hours will allow public access to the lobby, kitchen, and restrooms; restroom access outside of office hours is not anticipated.

Social Programming

The Committee discussed potential low-cost programming to welcome the community into the new space, including trivia nights, potlucks, tapas or charcuterie events, movie nights, and scavenger hunts.
