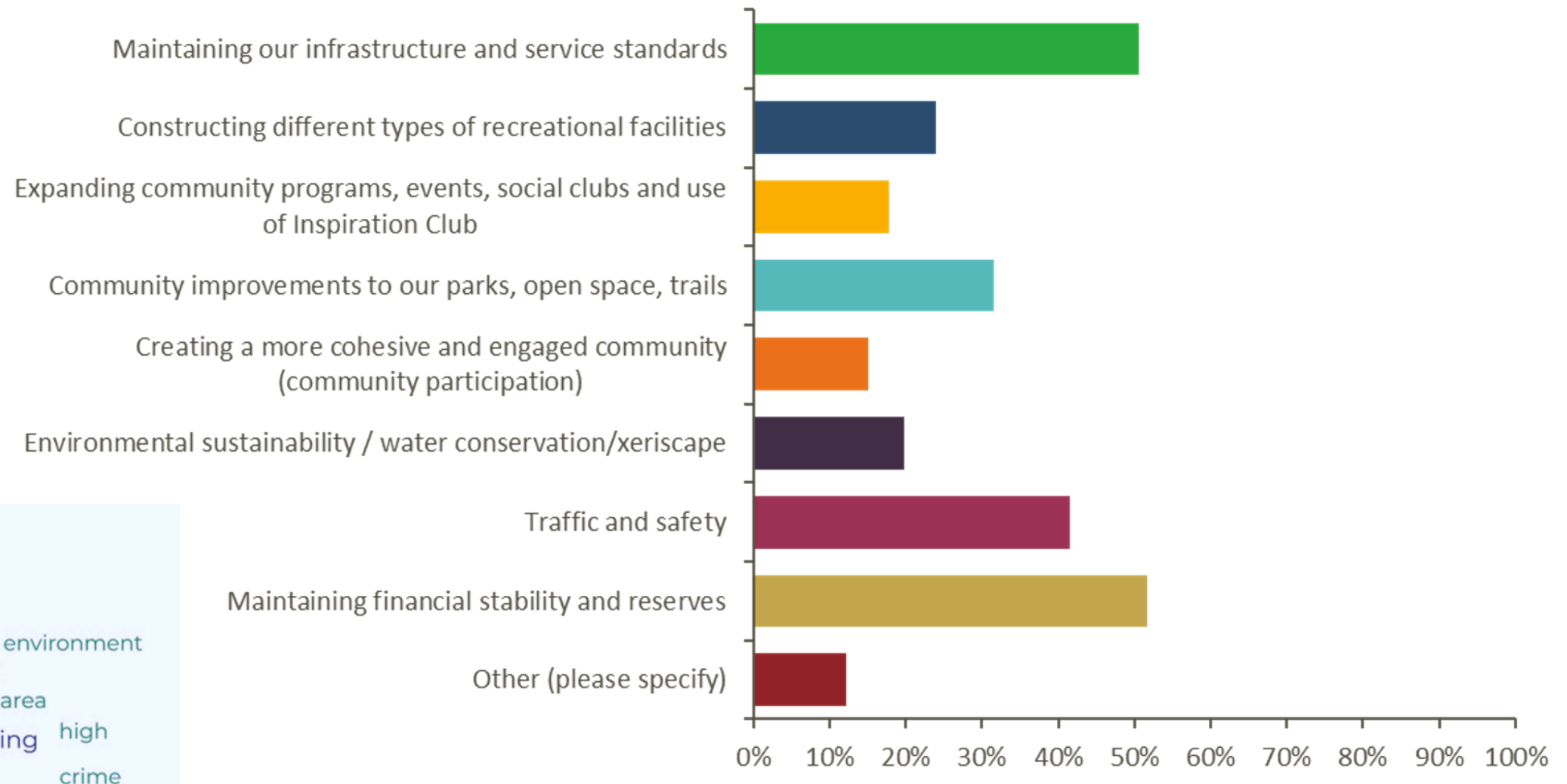

"Good communication and being open to suggestions and different ideas."



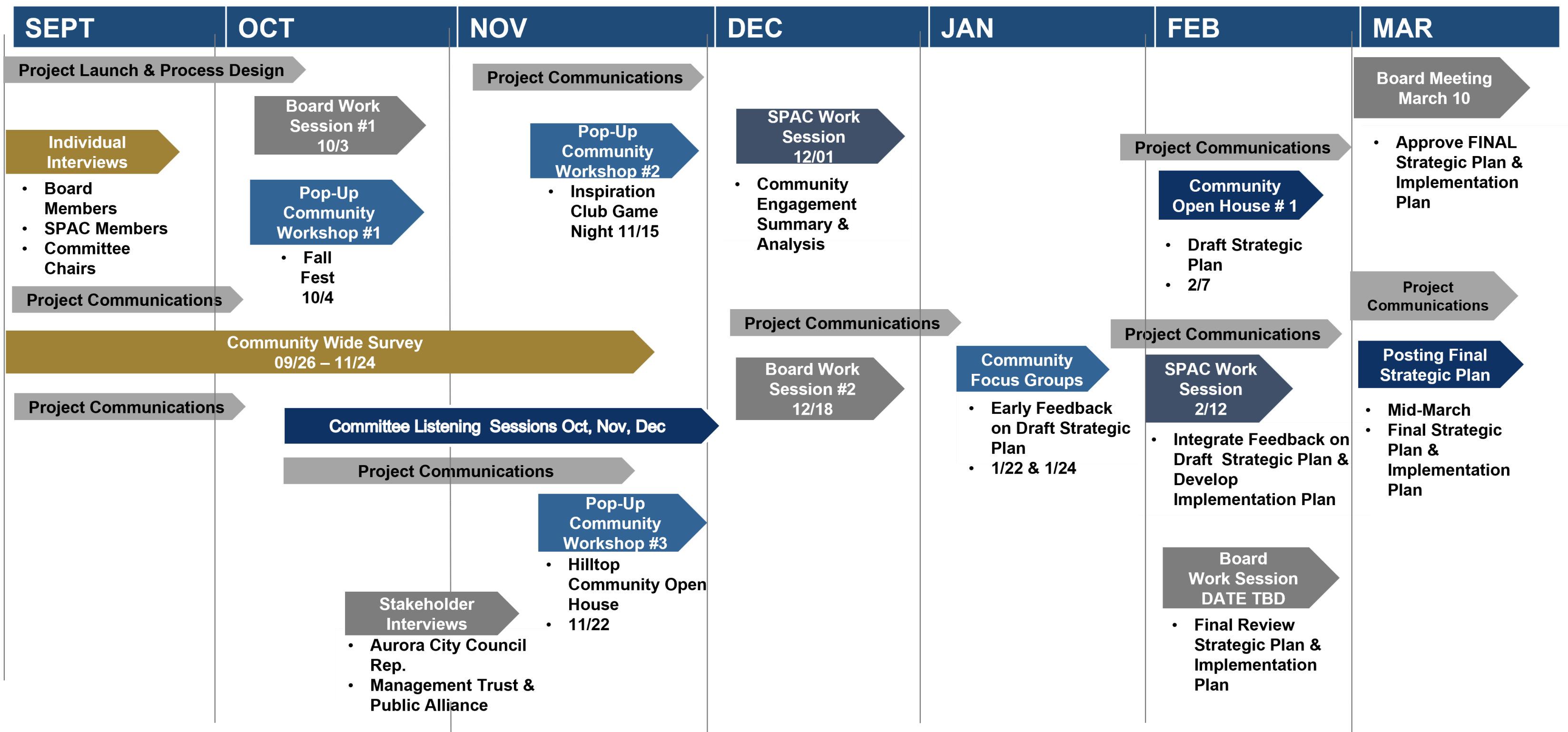
"Making everyone feel involved in the community and "bigger family". Having people take pride in the community where they live."

We are a welcoming and engaged community that provides a safe, beautifully maintained environment where residents truly feel at home.

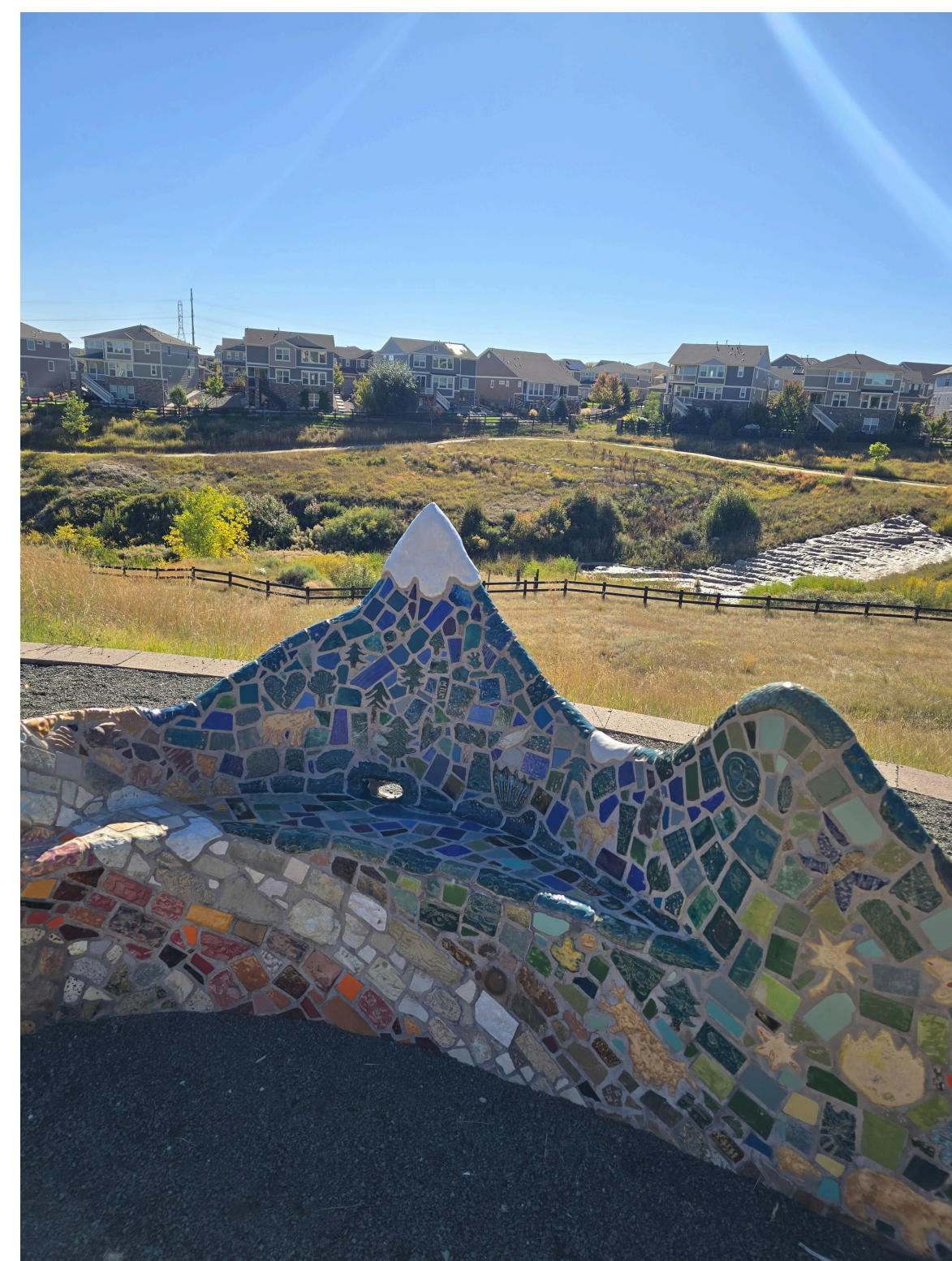
Guiding Principles

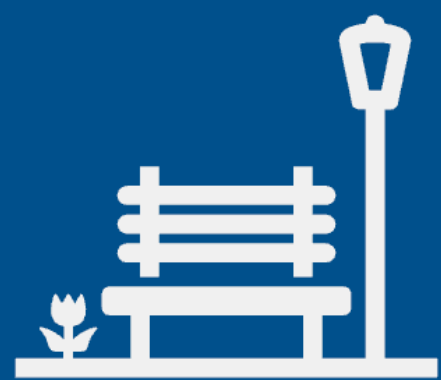
